ABSTRACT

This set of instructions for producing a proceedings poster abstract for the 2008 Winter Simulation Conference (WSC) with L^AT_EX also serves as a sample file that you can edit to produce your submission. Please follow the guidelines herein when preparing your abstract. Failure to do so may result in a paper being rejected, returned for appropriate revision, or edited without your knowledge.

REQUIREMENTS

The easiest way to create your abstract using L^AT_EX that complies with the requirements is to edit the source file, `wsc08poster.tex`, for this document. When you edit this file to create your abstract, simply replace the text of the title, authors and abstract, and delete this section.

If you are a *plenary* presenter, then please also include an author biography section. Such a section is commented out in the source for this file. You can simply uncomment that section and modify it for your purposes.

Your abstract should be at most 150 words. Since abstracts will also appear in the final program, the length limit of 150 words for each abstract will be strictly enforced. The abstract should consist of a single paragraph, and it should not contain references or mathematical symbols. Do not include a list of keywords as they are not used in WSC proceedings.

Your abstract will look the same as the first page of a proceedings paper, except that the abstract is centered within a single column. The paper size, margins, and fonts are the same as in a proceedings paper. The formatting of author information should also be the same as in papers. See the instructions for authors using L^AT_EX for the relevant information on how to format these items.
